Grants Awarded in New Alpha Chi Competition

LITTLE ROCK, Ark.—Alpha Chi launched its “In Scholarship and in Service” Grant Competition this fall to support members as they advance in their professions and pursue lifelong learning and service. These small grants may be used to cover things such as graduate school applications, exam fees, certifications, conference registrations, and travel to service work.

This new regional competition replaces the seven different regional scholarship competitions formerly held each spring semester. The competition is open to alumni members as well as undergraduate and graduate student members. With over 80 applications submitted this fall across Alpha Chi’s seven regions, the new competition showed a significant increase in applications over the retired programs, and the new award structure promises to make grants accessible to more members than before.

Judging teams from each of Alpha Chi’s seven regions reviewed the applications with each region awarding up to five \$200 grants to members from among their chapters. The winners from each region are listed below along with their university of induction. We congratulate these Alpha Chi members and appreciate the dedication of the advisors from each region who reviewed the applications.
